Sainik Bandhu, Hapur, Sainik Kalyan Evam Punirwas Nideshalaya UP, through Zila Sainik Kalyan Officer Lt Col Vivek Sigh, and Gram Pradhan Bankhanda joined hands with AGT in this noble initiative.

Creation of Shaheed Smiriti Upwan to salute the supreme sacrifice of martyrs, will not only keep the memory of the martyr alive, but also protect the environment. The flourishing garden will send a message from the departed martyrs.

### A trailblazing event worthy of emulation

\_While the Defence Forces ensure the citizens of Bharat can sleep peacefully by guarding its borders with their lives, the over thirty lakh strong veteran community can play a stellar role in safeguarding the environment, the alarmingly steady degeneration of which, threatens the survival of future generations. River Ganga, flowing through 52 districts, provides the veteran community and the Army Establishment, a unique opportunity to address the woefully meagre two percent forest cover of the Ganga Basin, home to forty percent of our population, as against





the national average of twenty-six percent, That it will increase the reverence for our Defence Forces and the veteran community manifold, needs no elaboration.

Families of local martyrs planted a sapling each to honour the supreme sacrifice by the departed A board listing the names of valiant local martyrs was erected. Local veterans volunteered to nurture the planted saplings.

To instill a sense of competition for a noble cause, the plantation area was divided for plantation and nurturing of saplings among ESM Community, students of local schools, villagers of Bankhanda, villagers of Dayanatpur, and NCC cadets of 38 Battalion NCC. Plantation drive commenced on 25 July with plantation by cadets of 38 Battalion NCC. Kargil Vijay Diwas on 26 July was celebrated through plantation by veterans to display their role model contribution to environment protection, and a team from 56 Field Regiment. The process continued with plantation by villagers of Bankhanda, Dayanatpur.Nali Huseinpur, Rasalpur, and local school,
